Children's Technology Habits

Many of you, like me, are concerned about some of the negative impacts of technology on our young people (there are of course many positives too). I thought you might be interested to know about a survey of 7,000 parents in Europe by Norton which has revealed concern about children's technology habits. 43% of parents are concerned that the use of technology is adversely impacting their children's sleep. 38% expressed fears about the impact of mobile phone and tablet use on social skills and 32% thought there was a potential negative impact on mental health.

The survey, which included parents of children aged between 5 and 16 years old, found that British children were spending on average 3 hours a day on their mobile phones.

The article identifies the following E-safety tips

- Set house rules such as screen time limits, and what children are allowed to view
- Talk to children about what they do and see online
- Encourage them to communicate with friends in online social spaces
- Teach children to think before they click
- Use tech tools to limit how much inappropriate content they see
- Discuss the risks of posting private data, images and videos to social networks
- Be a good role model

E-safety is a priority on this year's School Development Plan. We have three goals which we are asking all families to adhere to in their own homes in order to help keep their children safe online.

- 1. No more than 2 hours using technology in one day (an hour on a school day) As the driving instructors say 'this is a limit not a target!'
- 2. No games/ social media used where children are below recommended age limit. (Although many parents believe they are adhering to this, concerns can remain where the technology is used by older siblings/ parents and then younger children see this or take part without parents realising)
- 3. All technology to be kept in communal areas and no online technology in children's bedrooms. (ipads, smartphones, x-box etc.)

Christmas Jumper Day – Bring in £1

We are pleased to be joining in with the national Christmas Jumper Day on Friday 14th December, which raises money for the Save the Children charity. It would be nice if any old Christmas jumpers were donated to school so that we have some for children who don't own a Christmas jumper.
