A blue moon occurs when there are two full moons in a month, the second one being named a Blue Moon.



A Supermoon occurs when the moon is closest to the earth at the same time that it is full. On this occasion these both took place at the same time. I wonder if you, like me, looked up at the sky in wonder on these nights and thought of all the other people around the world doing just the same thing.

Around this time I had an interesting chat with a local farmer who was telling me about how some farmers believe the best harvests are collected on nights when there is a full moon when the tidal pull is strongest. There is so much of nature we still don't fully understand, but it never fails to inspire and provoke thought. For me the school year beginning with a Blue Supermoon adds to the feeling that this year, our 150th anniversary year, will be a truly remarkable one. Once again we are humbled by the wonderful world and indeed the universe.
